ratioAcad		Compare to [ratio] above. Words with a low number (i.e. below 1.50 are actually less frequent in Academic than in COCA as a whole, but they are still included in these lists, because they do below to the specific sub-genre
freqGenre		The frequency in the sub-genre (e.g. <i>freqLaw</i>)
ratioGenre	3.00	A ratio showing how much more frequent the word is in the sub-genre than in COCA Academic overall (per million words)
